## Useful Admission Information for Patients

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### **USEFUL ADMISSION INFORMATION FOR PATIENTS**

There will be a wait from the time that you are asked to arrive at the hospital to the time you go to theatre to have your procedure performed by Mr Johnson. This wait is due to administration purposes, as there will be a number of patients on Mr Johnson's list to be admitted, seen and taken to theatre.

When you arrive at the hospital you will be seen by the Admissions Clerk who will go through any necessary information regarding your stay i.e. questionnaires and payment details etc. You will then be taken to your room on the ward where you will have any required investigations such as blood tests, ECG, chest x-ray etc.

Mr Johnson and his Anaesthetist will see you in your room before you go to theatre to go through the consent process and answer any questions that you may have prior to the procedure.

Mr Johnson and the Anaesthetist will need to see all the patients on the list before they can start operating and therefore there will be a wait before you are taken down to the operating room. Lists are prioritised according to the length of the procedure and on the whole, day-case patients are operated on before patients who require an in-patient stay.

Finally, day-case admissions will be discharged by Mr Johnson's ward discharge team as Mr Johnson is often still operating when the day-case patients are due to be discharged.
